

HILLDALE MEN'S CLUB HAZARD MARKINGS

ALL HAZARD LINES DRAWN, WHETHER THEY ARE WHITE, RED OR YELLOW, OVERRIDE ANY STAKES FOUND MARKING THE SAME HAZARD OR BOUNDARY.

HOLE 1. Out-of-bounds (OB) stakes or lines located on the left side of the hole continuing behind the green to the street. Any ball in the street is OB.

HOLE 2. OB stakes or lines located along the left side of the hole before the first pond. After the first pond through the green, anything left of the cart path is marked "RED" for lateral including the backyards of the houses. A ball can not be played from the backyards, but it is not OB. Drop a ball with a penalty, two club lengths from the edge of the hazard where the ball crossed. The edge of the hazard is the left side of the cart path. There is no OB after the first pond.

HOLE 3. OB stakes or lines located left of the hole through the last telephone pole. All water is lateral.

HOLE 4. OB stakes or lines on left side and around the back of the green.

HOLE 5. Wooden fence from tee through #6 tee is OB. Water is lateral.

HOLE 6. Wooden fence on left side is OB line. All water is lateral. RED line on the far side of the cart path behind the green is LATERAL line. Drop nearest point of relief (consult with your group if in doubt)

HOLE 7. Wooden fence on left is OB. Where the fence turns left around housing property, the OB line does also. OB line or stakes behind green from cul-de-sac.

HOLE 8. OB line on left side of cart path and also behind the green. Woods on right side are a lateral hazard.

HOLE 9. Cul-de-sac surrounded by OB stakes. Wooden fence on left side by houses is OB.

HOLE 10. Wooden property line fence is OB. Where the fence ends and the wooded area begins is lateral and is marked with red stakes or line. Water in front of the green is a regular water hazard, not lateral. White stakes behind the green are OB.

HOLE 11. Wooded area on the left side of the hole from the blue tee to the white stake that is just past all the trees on the left by the houses is all RED staked up until the first white stake. From that white stake, to the second white stake by the big bushes after the houses, all the way through the green on the left side of the hole is OB left of the fence and that white stake. The fence behind the green is OB. Right of the cart path over the bridge by the green is OB. Water in front of the green is a regular water hazard not lateral. A ball that lands over the water and rolls back into the water must be dropped on the fairway side of the water, meaning you have to go back to the other side and drop as far back as you want, inline with the flag from where you entered the hazard. OB stakes also run along the right side of the hole along Huntington Blvd to the fire hydrant and back up along the property line of the townhouses.

HOLE 12. OB is Hassel Road, not the telephone poles. ADP parking lot is OB. FROM THE TEE BOX TO THE ENTIRE RIGHT SIDE INCLUDING THE TREES ON THE RIGHT ARE OB

(white stakes). IF A BALL IS HIT INTO THE TREES ON THE RIGHT AND THE GROUP IS NOT SURE IF THE BALL ENDED UP IN BOUNDS OR OB, THEN THE BALL MUST BE FOUND IN BOUNDS/IN THE CREEK TO BE CONSIDERED IN BOUNDS. IF THE BALL IS NOT FOUND THE PLAYER MUST GO BACK AND RE-TEE. WE RECOMMEND HITTING A PROVISIONAL FROM THE TEE-BOX IF THE GROUP IS UNSURE.

DO NOT PLAY FROM THE VILLAGE PROPERTY, as it is OB

– REHIT FROM TEE.

THE CREEK IS A WATER HAZARD (yellow stakes)

HOLE 13. Left side of the cart path all the way around the green and to the 14th tee is lateral. Use the lateral hazard options. Any ball hit into the lake on the right on a fly, should be played from the designated drop area about 30 yards short of the green. Any ball that rolls into the lake, short of the drop zone, should be played from where it crossed the hazard, not all the way up at the drop zone. A ball that lands over the water and rolls back into the hazard can be played from that spot that it rolled back in at.

PLACE/ROLL YOUR BALL IN THE DROP ZONE.

HOLE 14. All water is lateral. The fence on the left marks OB. The stakes on the right mark OB.

HOLE 15. OB stakes are located both left and right sides through the green. The sidewalk behind the green lined up with the last OB stake on the right is OB.

HOLE 16. Left side of cart path is OB - white lined as OB. Right side shrubs and tall grasses behind the green are lateral hazard. Balls hit into the waste area/environmental area, are not to be played from hazard. Go to drop area in front of ladies tee, one stroke penalty. Balls hit beyond waste area/environmental area and cross into the hazard on the right may be played within two club lengths from where ball entered hazard, one stroke penalty. A ball that bounces into the waste area may be played as lateral hazard. . **PLACE YOUR BALL IN THE DROP ZONE ONLY - ALL OTHER DROPS DO NOT IMPROVE YOUR LIE**

HOLE 17. **THERE IS NO DROP ZONE ON THIS HOLE ANYMORE. IF A BALL IS HIT INTO THE HAZARD ON THE RIGHT IT IS CONSIDERED LATERAL. THE GROUP OF GOLFERS MUST AGREE ON WHERE THE BALL ENTERED THE HAZARD AND CONTINUE PLAY FROM THERE. IF A POINT OF ENTRY CAN'T BE AGREED ON THEN PLAY 2 BALLS AND ASK THE COMMITTEE TO MAKE A RULING AFTER THE ROUND AFTER TALKING TO EACH PLAYER IN THAT GROUP ABOUT THE SITUATION.**

Water in front of the green and left of the bridge is a regular hazard. Left side of the hole is all lateral. Do not play from the driving range. Take a penalty and drop within two club lengths of where the ball crossed the hazard line.

HOLE 18. A white line on the left edge of cart path on the left and all the way to where we park the carts by the green is OB. White stakes from there and behind the green.

******WHEN IN DOUBT ABOUT ANY RULING – PLAY 2 BALLS AND LET THE COMMITTEE MAKE THE RULING**

FREE DROP AREAS: Garden beds are free drop areas. Garden beds are any area with flowers, and or other assorted plants and trees in a distinguishable group arrangement. Example: behind #4 green or behind #17 green. There are several other areas. Consult with your group if you are in doubt. Do not hit from these areas. Find the nearest point of relief and within one club length, no closer to the hole, take a drop.

TREES WITH MULCH ARE IN PLAY – BUSHES ON #1 BETWEEN #1 AND #9 BALL IS CONSIDERED UNPLAYABLE – 1 STROKE PENTLY WITH 2 CLUB RELIEF.
